## **TENAFLY'S AGE-FRIENDLY INITIATIVE UPDATE**

We are very happy to report that the Borough's efforts to improve the quality of life for our senior residents of Tenafly are continuing to progress. Thanks to the productive partnership between borough officials and the volunteers serving on the Tenafly Senior Services Committee our planning and implementation work is on schedule for 2017. As of December 2016, the following tasks were accomplished:

- Restored the Tenafly Senior Center to full staffing with the promotion of Rebecca Stauffer to the position of Center Director and the hiring of Michele Hausch as the Assistant Director. Rebecca and Michele have forged a great working relationship and the center is thriving!
- Completed the recruitment and hiring of Christine Lidestri, Licensed Social Worker, as the part-time Senior Services Coordinator, located at Borough Hall. Ms. Lidestri is presently working very closely with Gloria Layne, Senior Services Committee Chair, to compile data, make critical networking connections with social service providers, and establish policies and procedures for her senior assistance duties.
- Awarded a contract for the purchase of a minibus to be used for the Tenafly's Senior Transportation Program. The Administration and the Senior Services Committee are presently designing the formal structure of the transportation program. The recruitment and hiring of program staff will take place in the spring in advance of the vehicle delivery in order to provide adequate time for orientation and training. Transportation services are set to commence in June 2017.

Our overall goal is help Tenafly seniors to lead healthy and satisfying lives in the community that they love. This includes 1) helping individuals and family members to become better informed about the programs and services that are available to Tenafly residents; 2) creating linkages to and supplementing existing services; 3) helping residents to navigate the system of senior services at all levels of government, and 4) identifying gaps in services and advocating for services that will help to improve health and welfare, socialization, and mobility.

**This is an exciting and dynamic initiative and we look forward to bringing you more detailed program materials and scheduling details in the coming weeks and months.**

### TIME TO RENEW YOUR PET LICENSE!


In the beginning of every year, under state law, Tenaflly Borough residents are required to renew the licenses for their dogs and cats. Renewal notices were mailed out on December 29<sup>th</sup>. In case you did not receive your renewal license, you can click on the Online Pet Registration link on the Borough website. You can also use this site if you are registering your pet for the first time.

You just input your information and your pet's information. You need to upload the rabies certificate and other applicable documents. Payment is accepted via debit or credit card. You will receive all confirmations via e-mail until you receive the license and tag in the mail.

During the renewal process, applications will only be accepted online or by mail. So, if you do not have access to a computer, you can send back your renewal form with the rabies certificate and payment to: Borough of Tenaflly, 100 Riveredge Road, Tenaflly, NJ 07670 – ATTN: Pet Licensing. The renewal form can be accessed under Online Municipal Forms (2017 pet registration).

If your pet's rabies vaccine expires before October 31, 2016 you must either obtain a booster shot or a certificate of exemption (VPH-28) from the veterinarian. This is also required under state law.

Renewals must be received by February 28<sup>th</sup> to avoid a late fee of \$10. If you file a renewal online starting March 1<sup>st</sup>, the \$10 late fee will automatically be included in the charge.

## EXPANDED OPTIONS FOR ASSISTANCE DURING EMERGENCIES

Tenaflly now has the ability to operate two warming and cooling centers for the community. They are located at the Senior Center and the McCandless Room. These two locations cannot be approved for providing overnight accommodations due to their design and layout. These two sites enable the Borough to offer a warm or air conditioned space during brief periods of extreme temperatures. These two facilities also afford residents the opportunity to recharge cell phones if our area is affected by wide-spread power outages. These locations can also serve as meeting points for families affected by localized disasters, or transition points for those seeking refuge at a Bergen County or Red Cross shelter.

### PLEASE SEE THE ACTIVATION AND UTILIZATION POLICIES LISTED BELOW:

1. Warming & cooling centers will be activated by the Office of Emergency Management, in consultation with emergency services leadership and the Borough Administrator.
2. Both locations will be used as warming & cooling centers and cell phone charging sites.
3. Sleeping accommodations are not available at these two sites. Residents in need of overnight housing will be directed to local hotels, homes of family and friends, and Bergen County Shelters ( when available).
4. The centers cannot support residents with special medical needs. Those requiring medical care may be referred to local area hospitals or Bergen County Shelters, depending on their needs.
5. Consumption of food or alcohol is prohibited in these centers. Bathroom facilities are available, however shower and bathing are not provided .
6. Pets are not permitted.
7. The two centers are designated for Tenaflly residents only.
8. The hours of operation will vary based upon the timing and the nature of the incident.
9. Notification of warming & cooling center openings and closings will be conducted via "Code Red" along with posted notices at each center. In addition, social media along with message boards will also be used for public notifications. In extreme cases of severe disaster, roving patrols with public address speakers or door-to door notifications may have to be made.
10. Warming & cooling centers will require borough services for security, maintenance, and additional staff to assist with the operation of the centers.
11. Children cannot be left unattended. ( NO babysitting services are provided.)

In terms of "NOTIFICATIONS" the Tenaflly Office of Emergency Management strongly suggests that all residents register online for the CODERED to receive email and text notifications. Texts and e-mails are more likely to transmit even when traditional landlines are out of service. As we experienced during Superstorm Sandy, many residents were without power and phone service for several days. However, cellular phone service providers had fully functional systems within hours of the storm. We strongly suggest that residents have multiple cell phone chargers and ensure that their phones are always fully charged. Residents should have cell phone chargers for use in their vehicles as well, since this is a great option to use when household power is out of service. Oh yes, and ensure your vehicles are full of gasoline as gas pumps run on electricity.

Most weather events afford some level of advanced warning & entail advance-planning (hurricanes, snow storms, nor'easters, heat waves, and extended cold spells). This will allow the OEM office to coordinate advance notifications to borough residents. However, some catastrophic incidents such as Tornados, large scale power outages and gas explosions are spontaneous events which cannot be pre-planned. Based upon the type and size of the disaster, communications may be interrupted, and roadways to these centers may be impassible. Finally, please remember that first responders may be dedicated to life-saving efforts during the first hours or days after the event, so we cannot guarantee immediate service, but here are some actions that residents can take to lessen the negative impact of emergency events at home:

- Charge your cell phones, tablets and other mobile devices
- Fill up your car's fuel tank
- Ensure that you have a battery-powered radio and a supply of fresh batteries
- Check your supply of flashlights, blankets, non-perishable food and bottled water
- Have matches and candles with holders on-hand and use caution with both products
- If electricity is interrupted, keep refrigerator doors closed as much as possible during power outages
- Compile a list of emergency phone numbers
- Stay away from downed power lines
- Turn off lights and appliances to avoid over-loading circuits once power is restored
- DO NOT use generators indoors
- Exercise a good neighbor policy. If power goes out on your neighbor offer your house for shelter.
- Check-in on elderly friends, neighbors, and relatives
- Ensure that pets are cared for and kept warm

 **CodeRED**® Residents are reminded and encouraged to sign up for the Borough's **CODERED** emergency notification system to receive emergency information messages regarding matters and events that directly affect the Borough of Tenaflly and/or immediate surrounding communities. Residents can sign up to receive the information via cellular phone voice messages, text messages and email messages by clicking on the "CODERED" text located on the lower right hand side of the Borough of Tenaflly's website homepage. Follow the prompts to register for emergency notifications. Residents can unsubscribe at any time through the same link.

## A MESSAGE FROM THE TENAFLY BOARD OF HEALTH

***It's not too late to get a flu shot!!*** The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends a yearly flu vaccine for everyone six (6) months of age and older. Flu season in the United States is usually in the fall and winter months. The peak of the season is between October and April. The flu can be a very serious disease that can lead to hospitalization and sometimes even death. The flu can be prevented in several ways:

- Get the flu vaccine
- Cover coughs and sneezes
- Wash Hands frequently
- Avoid sick people
- Clean commonly shared or frequently touched items
- Treat flu illness to prevent serious complications.
- Ask your healthcare provider about medication (antivirals) as soon as you notice any flu symptoms.

***Glaucoma*** is a group of diseases that damage the eye's optic nerve and can often result in vision loss and blindness. Fortunately, with early detection and treatment, you can often protect your eyes against vision loss. An eye care professional is the best person to answer specific questions. Anyone can develop glaucoma. Some people are at a higher risk than others—African Americans over age 40, everyone over age 60, especially Mexican Americans and people with a family history of glaucoma.

**The Tenafly Board of Health encourages residents to take care of their eyes!! A visit to an eye care professional will assure picture perfect vision for years to come!**

## TENAFLY POLICE DEPARTMENT'S RESIDENT EMERGENCY CONTACT & SPECIAL NEEDS REGISTRATION

Residents wishing to provide emergency contact information or special needs information about themselves, or family members may do so by completing the appropriate forms and submitting them to the police department. The forms can be obtained by visiting the police department's webpage and clicking onto "**Services for our Residents**", or by picking the forms up in the department's lobby. The forms can be submitted by dropping them off at the department, sent regular mail, or by emailing them to [rchamberlain@tenafly.net](mailto:rchamberlain@tenafly.net).

Specifically, the new *Resident Emergency Contact Information* form can assist the department with making quick contact with you for emergencies involving loved ones, your property, or other pressing matters, while the *Special Needs Registration* form can provide important information about residents who have special needs, including persons with physical disabilities or impairments, or those who may require special handling by emergency services personnel.



## SNOW REMOVAL REGULATIONS



After leaf season, the main priority of the DPW is to keep borough streets clear of snow and ice. Residents can help by not throwing snow onto the streets. It is against Borough Code to shovel or plow snow onto the streets. The reason for this prohibition is **safety** – as snow melts and refreezes it causes icy spots that can cause serious accidents.

Snow removal regulations (*Borough Ordinance 12-3*) require property owners and/or tenants to clear snow from sidewalks within 12 hours of daylight after snow has stopped, or within 8 hours of daylight after snow has stopped in business districts B1 and B2. If snow or ice is so frozen to the sidewalks as to make complete removal impractical, the ice or snow must be covered with sand or salt.

If a fire hydrant is located on your property, snow or ice must be removed within 24 hours in residential districts, or 8 hours in business districts. You can help protect lives, homes and businesses in an emergency by keeping these hydrants clear.

Residents are asked to instruct private contractors engaged in the snow plowing of their property to not push the snow into the street. It is unlawful for any owner, tenant or private contractor to throw, place or deposit snow or ice that has accumulated on private property, including private driveways, upon streets in the Borough. Violators of these regulations are subject to issuance of summons and possible fine. We ask that you comply with these regulations for the safety of your family, friends and neighbors.

## SNOW REMOVAL TIPS

- **MAKE EVERY ATTEMPT TO PARK OFF THE ROAD....**this will allow for full width plowing and provide for curb line parking after the event
- **SHOVEL YOUR DRIVE WAY TO THE LEFT....** facing your home at the road edge, throw snow to the left....when / if plows return to widen, there will be less snow to be plowed back into your driveway
- **WE ASK YOU TO BE PATIENT! WAIT FOR US TO FINISH....**many people dig out prior to crews widening out streets only to be plowed back in and aggravated
- **REMAIN INDOORS IF POSSIBLE....**if you can...stay off the roads to permit ease of plowing operations and a less dangerous atmosphere for all
- **WAIT TO PUT OUT YOUR TRASH OR RECYCLING UNTIL PLOWING IS COMPLETED.** We don't wish to cover these items with snow and avoiding them in the road causes that area to be unplowed.

### Community Paper Shredding Event

#### PROPER DISPOSAL OF BRANCHES AND TREE LIMBS

Sticks, branches, shrub and tree limbs from residents' yards are collected by the garbage contractor, **Waste Industries**. They must be put into a garbage can and placed at the curb for pick up on regular garbage collection days. Large branches must be cut into lengths 3 feet or less and bundled for pick up. For limbs larger than 6-inch diameter, you must call Waste Industries at 201-567-3100 to schedule pick up.

Do not use blue borough recycling containers, this material is not recyclable.

## TENAFLY RECYCLING & CONVENIENCE CENTER

### REGULATIONS & REMINDERS:

- No idling of vehicles while at center.
- No trailers or commercially registered vehicles permitted.
- Plastics #1 - #5 only are accepted for recycling.
- Styrofoam & plastic bags are not recyclable – place in trash.
- Please read signage for proper disposal of items. If unsure, ask attendant.
- Decal is required for use. Authorization form is available at DPW Office, 107 Grove Street. Residents must provide driver’s license and vehicle registration.



### PROPERLY FILLED RECYCLING CONTAINERS:

*Place clean, rinsed recyclables loosely in approved 20 gallon recycling containers (without lids) at the curb on your scheduled collection day.*



Thanks to the efforts of the Mayor and Council, the Historic Preservation Commission is pleased to add the historic Charles Everett-Harvey Dunn house at 20 Forest Road to the roster of landmarked properties in town! The home, designed by noted architect Richard Morris Hunt and built in 1867, has been occupied by a number of prominent residents. Charles Everett was an early Tenafly civic leader, and was present when Elizabeth Cady Stanton attempted to vote in 1880. Harvey Dunn was an illustrator who rose to fame by depicting World War I scenes, and later a trustee on the Tenafly Board of Education. In the 1970s, the Swiss-chalet style home was occupied by Grammy-award winning jazz musician George Benson and his family, and as recently as last September, was visited by presidential candidate Hillary Clinton on her campaign tour. The HPC continues to work with residents and the governing body to enhance the list of landmarked properties and, thus promote Tenafly's rich history and unique character.

**The new Centennial Sign program has seen its first plaque go up in the downtown commercial district:**

10 West Railroad Avenue, the location of Zestt restaurant and part of the backdrop to the Historic Railroad Station, now proudly displays a new Centennial plaque, on the front of the building. This successful program offered by the Historic Preservation Commission allows owners of “centennial” (or 100-year) homes in Tenafly to acknowledge their home’s “birth” date, and its proud role in forming part of the Borough’s character. The oval plaques cost \$225; applications for the Centennial sign program are available on the HPC webpage of the Borough website and at Borough Hall.
