2018 BUDGET CONTAINS NO TAX INCREASE

The 2018 Municipal Budget was introduced by the Mayor and Council at a public meeting held on March 20, 2018. Prior to introduction and adoption, the governing body held a series of budget deliberation meetings on February 10, February 13, and February 24, 2018. All meetings were convened in the Richard D. Wilson Committee Room at Borough Hall. The two Saturday sessions were convened from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., and the weeknight session was held on Tuesday from 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. The sessions consisted of in-depth reviews of the budget recommendations prepared by the Borough Administrator and Chief Financial Officer.

All borough Department Heads met with the governing body to review their budgets and respond to questions concerning their goals, objectives, and spending history. Managers were also requested to justify expenditures for new initiatives, where applicable. Copies of related budget information were made available for public review at Borough Hall and on the Borough website.

This is the Borough's eighth budget prepared under the state "Property Tax Levy Cap" which places a 2% CAP on the allowable amount to be raised by taxation to support the municipal budget in 2018. Additionally, total budget appropriation increases may not exceed 3.5% in accordance with the state's Appropriation CAP. The 2018 municipal operating budget was developed in compliance with these strict limitations.

The proposed tax levy for 2018 rose by \$236,648 from \$23,519,967 in 2017 to \$23,756,615, which equated to a 1% increase. This is lower than the 2% maximum allowable levy increase permitted by the state based on the local tax levy cap law. This change in the levy includes an increase in revenue of \$391,841 and an increase in appropriations of \$556,489.

The total 2018 property assessment valuation for the borough was \$3,991,368,900, an increase of \$41,401,000 over 2017. Based on the 2018 assessed valuation, the \$236,648 tax levy increase equated to a municipal tax rate of .595, which is the same rate as in 2017. Therefore, there is a **ZERO** percent municipal tax rate increase over 2017, resulting in the average tax per home of \$4,674, or an increase of **ZERO** over 2017 based on the 2018 average assessed valuation listed in the chart below:

A MESSAGE FROM THE TENAFLY POLICE DEPARTMENT

SCAM AWARENESS TIPS



The Police Department would like to remind residents of the prevalence of scams that continue to circulate throughout the community. The most common scams being reported continue to be the fraudulent phone call from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) that tries to scare you into believing you must pay fees to avoid being arrested or assessed fines, and the phone calls or electronic messages that ask for money to assist family members or friends who are in trouble. While the department hasn't investigated many of these cases recently, we are aware of some nearby communities whose residents were recently victimized.

Scammers are always looking for new methods to trick us into believing they're a legitimate company, organization or agency, and will try to get people to pay for erroneous bills, late fees, and fines. They also attempt to obtain personal information from you to update their files, and will provide a fraudulent link to do so. To avoid falling into these traps, hang up the phone or close out the electronic message and contact the company directly from a trusted source, not one they've provided.

Be mindful that the elderly are the most common age group to fall victim to this type of criminal activity. If you or anyone you know receives one of these types of communications, or any other suspicious attempt to draw personal information or money from you, record as much information as possible and report it to the Tenafly Police Department.



SPRING AND SUMMER YARD & GARDEN CLEAN-UP



All garden refuse except GRASS is considered debris and is collected by Waste Industries, the Borough's garbage contractor, on your regular garbage collection days. This includes weeds, hedge trimmings, sticks, plants, seed pods, etc. This material should be placed in garbage cans at the curb on your regular garbage pick-up day. Do not use blue recycling containers, as this material is not recyclable.

GRASS CLIPPINGS



The DPW collects grass clippings at the curb from residential properties on Mondays and Tuesdays from April 15th to October 15th on the schedule shown below. Grass clippings and leaves **ONLY** must be placed at the curb the night before pickup in **reusable 20-gallon containers with lids** or bio-degradable paper bags provided by the property owner. Grass collection begins at 7:00 am.

- Do not use blue recycling containers for grass clippings.
- Grass clippings placed in plastic bags are NOT collected under any circumstances.

GRASS CLIPPINGS PICKUP SCHEDULE:

West Side: Zones 3 and 4 - Grass picked up on MONDAYS only

East Side: Zones 1 and 2 - Grass picked up on TUESDAYS only


DISPOSAL OF GARDEN REFUSE, TREE BRANCHES & LIMBS



- Garden refuse and small branches are picked up by Waste Industries from garbage containers placed at curb on regular garbage collection days.
- Large branches must be securely tied in bundles, with a maximum length of 3 feet and placed at curb for pickup by Waste Industries on regular garbage collection days.



PUBLIC ELECTRIC CAR CHARGING STATIONS



Electric vehicles (EV) are increasingly being adopted by New Jersey drivers. A new AAA survey shows that 20 percent or 50 million Americans will likely go electric for their next vehicle purchase.

Greater range, lower maintenance cost and fuel costs and lower purchase prices have made EVs feasible for many consumers. In April 2018, there were 16 models of full electric cars (ZEV) being manufactured by 13 carmakers, and 29 models of plug-in hybrid cars (PHEV) by 15 manufacturers. In New Jersey, each electrically fueled car-mile is at least 70 percent cleaner than an average gasoline fueled mile.

The Environmental Commission has considered whether public EV chargers in Tenafly would be appropriate. The total cost to install one charger can range from about \$10,000 for a level 2 unit to \$50,000 for a level 3 charger. The capacity of the charger – lower for a level 2 charger than the level 3 – determines the time it will take to recharge the electric car. The time to fully recharge an EV depends on the size of its battery and the ability of the EV to accept a fast charge. The cost to the vehicle owner will be determined as part of the design process.

We are conducting a short survey to gauge how many EVs are in Tenafly and whether there is any interest in installing public charging stations. Most EV owners charge their cars at home, but public chargers could be available for use when the owner is dining or shopping in downtown Tenafly, or working in Tenafly, or when the residence charger is unavailable.

The most important question: What is the demand for public chargers in Tenafly?

If you live or work in Tenafly and own or will own a ZEV or a PHEV, we would like to know how you will charge your car and under what conditions would you use a public charger if units were available.


