## TENAFLY'S NEW DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS

With the retirement of Bob Culvert, the Borough of Tenafly sincerely welcomes Carl Rossi as its new DPW Director as of December 27, 2017. The Director is responsible for the planning and administration of all programs, personnel, and activities of the Department of Public Works. This covers a variety of matters in the Borough, which includes infrastructure (streets, roads, bridges, and stormwater and sanitary sewer lines); parks (including playgrounds and playing fields); shade trees, landscaping and tree maintenance; street signs, striping and traffic signals; and municipal buildings and facilities. With over twelve years of experience as a Director of Public Works, Carl brings to Tenafly extensive knowledge concerning managing potable water systems, waste water treatment systems, waste water conveyance systems, roadway and infrastructure maintenance and property improvement projects.



Carl graduated from Clifton High School in 1987. He attended the New Jersey Institute of Technology, where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering. He later went on to earn his MBA in Finance and Organizational Management from Rutgers University. In November of 2010, he received his Certified Public Works Manager license from the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs.

Carl was a former commissioner and chairman of the City of Clifton Environmental Commission where he helped the City obtain a grant for an Environmental Inventory Report. He is a member of the Bergen County Public Works Administrators Association and Public Works Association of New Jersey Region 1. He is also a coach and a board member of the Sportfriends Soccer Club in Wayne, NJ. Carl has a wife, Sheila, and four children Anna, Kathleen, Giuseppe and Michael.

## TENAFLY YOUTH CENTER: THE PLACE TO BE!

For more than twenty years, the Tenafly Youth Center has continued to serve the middle and high school-aged residents of Tenafly as their "home away from home" after school and on Saturdays. Although you do not have to be a formal member of the Youth Center to utilize the facility, we are proud to acknowledge that more than 1000 middle and high school students are registered members of the Youth Center. Mark Slawson, the Youth Services Director, notes that the facility currently experiences an average attendance of 60 to 70 students daily, with Friday being the most popular day; with sometimes over 100 students visiting. Not only do participants have the opportunity to just "hang out" and have fun with their friends from school, but at the Youth Center, they also have access to a multi-workstation computer room where they can enjoy quiet time to complete their assignments for school.

In an effort to continuously attract Tenafly's youth to make use of this very special drop-in center, Director Mark Slawson and his staff work vigorously year round to upgrade services and activities available at our facility, located at the southern end of the Municipal Center. They work together to create this safe and fun place where the youth and teens of our community can learn, grow, relax, and maintain friendships and memories they will cherish throughout their lives. - *Continued on Page 11*

*From the Desk of the Mayor...*

The Mayor's office is offering a new program to residents who wish to have their driveways and or sidewalks shoveled after it snows. A number of Tenafly High School and Middle School students have put their names on a list to assist residents after a snow storm. Residents need only call **the Mayor's office (201-568-6100 x5535) and leave the following information:** their name and address, phone number and what needs to be done. This information will be sent out to all of the students on the list, and if they are available, they will reach out to you. It is up to the resident and student to negotiate the time frame of the job and a price. If the resident would like the work done for free, they need to note that in their message to the Mayor. The Mayor will be checking his messages repeatedly (except overnight) so that this process will move forward quickly. Residents may get more than one response and it is up to the resident to choose one. Students know that in order to get work they need to respond as quickly as possible to any messages from the Mayor. The Mayor's office encourages both residents and students to provide feedback on how this program is working. Please call the Mayor's office if you require additional information.

As a dog owner and dog walker, I would like to share two concerns with you. First, people who walk their dogs and don't clean up after them make it very uncomfortable for responsible dog owners. Please pick up after your dog. Second, many of our streets do not have sidewalks. Therefore, dog walkers, joggers, bikers, and pedestrians must walk in the street. The speed limit on most streets is 25mph. When approaching someone who is walking in the street, please SLOW DOWN! It's more than just common courtesy by drivers, it's a safety issue.

Finally, steps are being taken to adjust the recyclable pick-up schedule so that residents in certain zones do not go without a pick-up for several weeks due to holidays. Look for scheduling changes to be announced very soon.

### TIME TO RENEW YOUR PET LICENSE!



If you have any questions, feel free to contact the Borough Clerk's Office at 201-568-6100.

In the beginning of every year, under state law residents are required to renew the licenses for their dogs and cats. Renewal notices were mailed out on January 2<sup>nd</sup>. In case you did not receive your renewal license, you can either call Borough Hall or click on the "Online Pet Registration" link on the Borough website home page. You can also use the website if you are registering your pet for the first time.

You just input your information and your pet's information. You need to upload the rabies certificate and other applicable documents. Payment is accepted via debit or credit card. You will receive all confirmations via e-mail until you receive the license and tag in the mail.

During the renewal process, applications will only be accepted online or by mail. So, if you do not have access to a computer, you can send back your renewal form with the rabies certificate and payment to: Borough of Tenafly, 100 Riveredge Road, Tenafly, NJ 07670 – ATTN: Pet Licensing.

**If your pet's rabies vaccine expires before October 31, 2018 you must either obtain a booster shot or a certificate of exemption (VPH-28) from the veterinarian. This is also required under state law.**

Renewals must be received (**not postmarked**) by Wednesday, February 28<sup>th</sup> to avoid a late fee of \$10. If you file a renewal online starting March 1<sup>st</sup>, the \$10 late fee will automatically be included in the charge.

### PROPERTY TAX GRACE PERIOD EXTENDED



First quarter 2018 taxes were due February 1st. The 10-day grace period has been extended from Saturday, February 10th to Monday, February 12th since February 10th falls over the weekend. Please be advised that should you pay your taxes after February 12th, interest shall be calculated and charged from the February 1st due date forward.

### COUNCILWOMAN LAUREN DAYTON

I have lived in Tenaflly for five years with my husband Dr. Jeffrey Dayton, a pediatric cardiologist, and our two daughters Emily (age 8) and Abigail (age 4). I moved to Tenaflly in 2012 for its small town charm appeal, good education and beautifully preserved homes.

I graduated in 2000 from Cornell University, majoring in policy analysis, focusing on economics and government. I then went to Emory School of Law, where I received my Juris Doctorate in 2003. Since 2003, I worked as a litigation attorney in major law firms in both New York City, New York and Atlanta, Georgia. My expertise is in commercial contracts, business law and employment matters, which is applicable to understanding and negotiating Tenaflly's contracts, encouraging small business growth and developing our town into a thriving commercial downtown again. ## MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER/TAX COLLECTOR

Dear Taxpayer:

Please be advised that a resolution is being introduced for adoption on February 6, 2018 as a matter of policy to allow for the refund of 2018 third and fourth quarter pre-paid property taxes. Should the resolution be adopted, per State guidelines, all refunds requested must be done based upon written request by each taxpayer and further authorized by the governing body. Your written request should be submitted to the Tax Office at the Tenafly Borough Hall. Along with your request a W-9 form for tax purposes must be submitted to the tax office as well.

Should the resolution be adopted, we will immediately accept requests and start processing refunds in March 2018.

## IT'S NOT TOO LATE TO GET A FLU SHOT!!

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends a yearly flu vaccine for everyone six (6) months of age and older. Flu season in the United States is usually in the fall and winter months. The peak of the season is between October and April. The flu can be a very serious disease that can lead to hospitalization and sometimes even death.

### The flu can be prevented in several ways:

- Get the flu vaccine

- Wash Hands frequently
- Avoid sick people
- Clean commonly shared or frequently touched items
- Treat flu illness to prevent serious complications. Ask your healthcare provider about medication (antivirals) as soon as you notice any flu symptoms.

- Drink plenty of liquids
- Get plenty of rest
- Stay home from work or school
- Call your healthcare provider

**RESCHEDULED RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING PICK-UP FOR MARCH 30TH IN ZONES 3 & 4**

**PROPER DISPOSAL OF BRANCHES AND TREE LIMBS**



**Sticks properly tied and bundled**

OR



**Sticks placed in garbage cans**

Sticks, branches, shrubs and tree limbs from residents' yards are collected by the garbage contractor, **Waste Industries**. They must be put into a garbage can and placed at the curb for pick-up on regular garbage collection days. Large branches must be cut into lengths 3 feet or less and bundled for pick-up. For limbs larger than 6-inch diameter, you must call Waste Industries at 201-567-3100 to schedule pick-up.

**Do not place yard debris in blue borough recycling containers, since this material is not recyclable.**

## WATER COURSES AND DRAINAGE DITCHES



This is an important reminder from Public Works that property owners are responsible for the maintenance of streams, water courses and drainage ditches that are located on their property. Section 12-4 of the Borough Code details the maintenance responsibilities of property owners and residents. It is unlawful for any owner, tenant or occupant of any lot or tract of land across which there exists any drainage ditch, ravine, stream, culvert or other water source, to permit the accumulation of loose brush, fallen leaves, tree branches, dead trees, stumps, garbage, trash and/or other debris to the extent that such accumulation presents a risk of washing downstream thereby causing a blockage of said water course, and/or flooding or damaging of adjacent downstream properties.

## HOW TO DISPOSE OF BULKY ITEMS, FURNITURE, APPLIANCES



Tenaflly residents may arrange with Waste Industries, the Borough's garbage contractor, to have curb-side pick-up of certain bulky waste, furniture, and household appliances by appointment. Residents must make arrangements and pay the contractor directly for the service, and the resident must bring the item or items to the curb for collection. Residents can call the contractor at 201-567-3100 to schedule a date for the collection and disposal of: refrigerators, freezers, clothes dryers or washers, televisions, toilet fixtures, sofas, upholstered chairs, hot water heaters, stoves or ovens, window air conditioners, mattresses or box springs. Removal of Freon from refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners is the responsibility of residents. However, if you bring this type of appliance to the Recycling Center, it is not necessary to remove the Freon.

### **IDLING VEHICLES ARE HARMFUL TO OUR ENVIRONMENT**

Nearly everyone has done this at one time or another: You arrive early to pick up the kids from school and leave the engine running while you wait. Or maybe you're waiting for a family member who has dashed into the bank or the grocery store—and you leave the car on.



It's just a few minutes, so it can't hurt, right? Idling is no big deal, is it?

Actually, idling is a big deal, and it's not just bad for your car, it is also bad for the environment. A car idling for just 10 minutes releases one pound of carbon dioxide, which is the primary contributor to global warming.

There are many excellent reasons why idling any vehicle for more than three minutes is against the law in New Jersey. Idling vehicles contribute to air pollution and emit toxins that are known to cause various health problems. According to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), air quality monitoring at schools has shown elevated levels of benzene, formaldehyde and other air toxins during afternoon pickup. Our children's lungs are still developing, and exposure to elevated levels of these pollutants significantly increases the risks of developing asthma, respiratory problems and other serious health issues.

By limiting your car's idling time, we can dramatically reduce these risks. And remember, today's electronic engines do not require vehicles to "warm up," even in winter. The fastest way to warm up your car—and its interior—is to simply ease into your drive.

### TENAFLY VOLUNTEER AMBULANCE CORPS

The Tenaflly Volunteer Ambulance Corps, also known as TVAC, was founded in 1992. Last year we celebrated our 25th anniversary as a volunteer ambulance corps that has provided the most rapid and appropriate response to medical emergencies. Since the founding of the corps, the number of emergency calls that we respond to has increased to more than one thousand (1,000) annually.

Each of our members has completed extensive training as Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs). All of our members volunteer their time and respond to calls 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. In addition to responding to emergency calls, our members continue to give back to the community by ensuring safety at town events and providing opportunities for young children to learn about emergency medical services.
