## **IMPORTANT NOTICE: AS OF NOVEMBER 1, 2019 PLASTIC BAGS WILL NOT BE RECYCLED**

Due to current recycling marketplace conditions, we can no longer accept any recycling material that either contains or is placed into plastic bags.

Commingled recyclable material must be clean and rinsed and placed into the blue Borough recycling bins.

Only glass, cans and plastics marked #1, #2 or #5 are acceptable. Do not place broken glass, glass shelving, windows or mirrors in recycling bins.

**Plastic bags, shrink wrap, Styrofoam or other debris material is not acceptable for commingled recycling.**

When this material is placed in with recycling, the Borough's load is rejected. Instead of receiving compensation for recycling, the Borough is charged a fee to dispose of it.

Paper/cardboard recyclable material includes paper, cardboard, envelopes/junk mail with no cellophane inserts, magazines, paperback books, telephone books, and shredded paper. This material may not be placed in plastic bags. Paper/cardboard recycling must be placed into the blue Borough recycling bins.

Do not use any bins larger than a 20 gallon capacity as they will not be picked up. Blue Borough recycling bins are available free of charge at the Tenafly Recycling & Convenience Center upon proof of residency.



## GENERAL ELECTION INFORMATION

**This year's General Election will be held on November 5 for Mayor and 2 Council seats.**

**Polls are open from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m.**

Vote by Mail Ballots are obtained through the Bergen County Clerk's Office in Hackensack. To have a Vote by Mail Ballot mailed to you, you must submit a Vote by Mail Ballot Application by October 29 to the Bergen County Clerk. After October 29, and until 3 p.m. on November 4, 2019, you may appear in person at the Bergen County Clerk's office and obtain and execute your Vote by Mail Ballot at that time. Call the County Clerk at 201-336-7020 for office hours. Vote by Mail Ballot Applications are available at the Tenafly Borough Clerk's office in Borough Hall.

**Reminder:** Once you have been issued a Vote by Mail Ballot, you can only vote via Vote by Mail Ballot at that election. All Ballots must be returned to the Bergen County Board of Elections by 8 p.m. on Election night. The Tenafly Borough Clerk cannot accept Vote by Mail Ballots.

Registered Tenafly voters will be receiving their sample ballots from the County Clerk's office within a few days before the election. In addition to the candidates running for office and public questions, the sample ballot also includes your Election District and address of your polling site.

*Also, please remember that the polling districts for registered voters in Districts 1, 2, & 7 were changed earlier this year.*

**A MESSAGE FROM THE TENAFLY POLICE DEPARTMENT:  
VEHICLE THEFT PREVENTION**



The Tenaflly Police Department would like to remind residents to remove vehicle key fobs and lock their cars. The key fob is the small security hardware device that provides most new cars with keyless entry and vehicle ignition.

The department has investigated 13 stolen vehicles and 28 car burglaries (cars entered) for 2019, compared to 8 vehicles stolen and 7 burglarized for all of 2018. This equates to a 62% increase in vehicles stolen and a 300% increase in cars burglarized this year.

The problem is not specific to the Borough of Tenaflly. Nearly every town in Bergen County is experiencing the same issue. Would-be thieves come to town mostly in the late evening and early morning hours looking for unlocked vehicles. If they find an unlocked vehicle with the fob left inside of it, they just drive off with it. If the vehicle was left unlocked with the fob removed, the thief rummages through the car looking for the fob and takes everything they can of value, i.e. cell phones, laptops, wallets/purses, sun glasses, money, etc. The department hasn't investigated a forced break-in to a vehicle in several years. Car thieves don't want to wake you or draw anyone's attention from the sound of breaking glass or a car alarm. Furthermore, it's nearly impossible to hotwire a late model car these days, so locking the vehicle and removing the key fob will practically eliminate the problem completely.

Residents are directed to report any suspicious persons or activity without delay to the department. Thank you for your anticipated cooperation to eradicate this preventable criminal activity from occurring in the Borough.



The Tenafly Volunteer Ambulance Corps, also known as TVAC, is dedicated to providing the most rapid and appropriate response to medical emergencies. Each of our members go through extensive training as Emergency Medical Technicians. Our membership is made up of your friends, family and neighbors who volunteer their time responding 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. In addition to responding to emergency calls, our members continue to give back to the community by ensuring safety at town events and providing opportunities for young children to learn about emergency medical services.

We want to remind our community that fall is here and winter is right around the corner! It will stay darker longer and the weather will be changing rapidly. Please be sure to remember to keep all paths and walkways cleared as well as having visible house numbers during inclement weather. This ensures everyone's safety and that patient care is given without delay. Also some tips for winter is to stock up with an emergency kit including a flashlight and extra batteries, a battery-operated radio, bottled water, non-perishable foods, essential medicines and extra blankets or sleeping bags.

## **From the Tenaflly Board of Health**

We, the members of the Tenaflly Board of Health, encourage everyone to get the vaccines recommended by the Center for Disease Control, and in the recommended schedules. For children, the recommended vaccines include MMR, Varicella, TDAP, and Hepatitis B, H. flu, influenza and HPV. For adults the recommended vaccines include TDAP, influenza, pneumococcal, HPV, and shingles.

The CDC recommendations are based on sound scientific data, accumulated by the medical community. The antivaxer movement, led by Andrew Wakefield, is based upon untruth. He published a study in *Lancet* in 1998 linking MMR to possible unfavorable outcomes. This data was subsequently deemed false, the article was retracted and Wakefield was stripped of his medical license by the UK.

## Leaf Mulching from the Tenaflly Green Team:

As the days grow shorter and summer begins to cool, we can look forward to the harbingers of autumn: pumpkin spice flavored everything and falling leaves. Most of us either rake and bag our own leaves or bring in landscaping crews to blow them into the enormous leaf piles that clog our streets every fall.

But what if there was an alternative to all those hours of raking and the noxious fumes of those ear-splitting leaf blowers? And what if that alternative was actually better for the environment and your lawn?

That alternative is leaf mulching. Instead of collecting and bagging the leaves, remove the grass catcher on your lawn mower and then raise the blades an inch or so higher. This technique, also known as mulch mowing, is quick and easy--and it saves precious time ordinarily spent on raking and bagging. Even better, the shredded leaves decompose and then act as a natural fertilizer and weed control agent, reducing the need to spend money on weed control products.

Not only does mulch mowing cut down on the use of those environmentally disruptive leaf blowers, it also can save the town money on leaf collection.

The Tenaflly Green Team encourages all residents to give leaf mulching a try; for those who hire landscaping contractors, it only takes a minute to ask them to leaf mulch.

And what will you do with all the time that you save? Maybe whip up a batch of pumpkin spice pancakes?

## Water Courses and Drainage Ditches



Residents are responsible for maintenance of streams, water courses and drainage ditches on their property. Section 12-4 of the Borough Code details the maintenance responsibilities of property owners and residents. It is unlawful for any owner, tenant or occupant of any lot or tract of land across which there exists any drainage ditch, ravine, stream, culvert or other water source, to permit the accumulation of loose brush, fallen leaves, tree branches, dead trees, stumps, garbage, trash and/or other debris to the extent that such accumulation presents a risk of washing downstream thereby causing a blockage of said water course, and/or flooding or damaging of adjacent downstream properties.

## TENAFLY RECYCLING & CONVENIENCE CENTER REGULATIONS & REMINDERS

1. No idling of vehicles while at center.
2. No trailers or commercially registered vehicles permitted.
3. Plastics #1, #2 or #5 only are accepted for commingled recycling.
4. Styrofoam & plastic bags are not recyclable –place in trash.
5. Please read signage for proper disposal of items. If unsure, ask attendant.
6. Decal is required for use. Authorization form is available at DPW Office, 107 Grove Street. Residents must provide driver's license and vehicle registration.



### USED CLOTHING AND SHOE DISPOSAL

The Tenaflly Recycling & Convenience Center accepts all used clothing and shoe items for recycling. Residents may bring all of these items to the Tenaflly Recycling & Convenience Center to be recycled. There is a Collection Box marked for these items. All items placed into these boxes are used, re-used or recycled into other items for use. Please consider donating these items. By reusing items, we save the natural resources needed to make them and save space in landfills. Making new items from old products saves our community money, conserves natural resources and reduces pollution of air, water and soil.



## LEAF COLLECTION

Each year, Borough-wide leaf collection begins October 15 and runs to December 1.

The Department of Public works collects leaves and grass only that is placed loosely at the curb. Do not cover storm drains or place leaf piles near storm drains. According to N.J. Stormwater Regulations, leaves must be placed at the curb no closer than ten (10) feet from a storm drain inlet. Please do not put brush, twigs, branches or any other foreign matter into these piles. It not only makes the job more difficult and dangerous, but also contributes to the break-down of our leaf collection equipment. To enable equipment access to pick up the leaves, do not park on or close to leaf piles. If you choose to bag your leaves, they must be put into biodegradable paper bags only.

Please call the DPW at 201-568-4134 to have the bags picked up.

Paper bags of leaves will be picked up from October 15 to January 31.

Plastic bags will not be collected under any circumstances.

Branches and twigs must be separated from leaves.



These are collected by Waste Industries on your regular garbage collection day. Branches, twigs and garden refuse should be placed into a reusable container (not larger than 30 gallon capacity) with lid at the curb for pickup with your garbage. Branches must be no longer than 3 feet in length and should be tied in bundles or neatly stacked at the curb for pickup by Waste Industries on regular garbage collection days.

#### **BEAR FACTS FROM THE ACCESS FOR ALL COMMITTEE:**

Before we moved to Tenaflly, my wife, youngest son and I lived in Northeastern Pennsylvania and North-western New Jersey, where black bears are common and frequently encountered. Recently I have heard tales of occasional ursine sightings in our fair borough and this inspired me to share some helpful hints with my fellow Tenaflly residents.

1. All bears native to NJ are black bears, regardless of their actual color. Though they are not as aggressive as other bears, respect the fact that they are still large and powerful wild animals. However, it is possible to peacefully coexist with them if you take some time to learn their habits.
2. Be alert for bears, especially from sunset until sunrise.
3. If you see a bear, keep your distance. Do not consider petting the bear or taking a selfie with the bear.
4. Communicate with your neighbors. Call them if you see a bear in the vicinity.
5. Don't act like prey by turning around, crouching down, running away or climbing a tree.
6. Don't challenge the bear by establishing eye contact.
7. Don't attempt to chase the bear away.
8. Don't feed the bears. Avoid feeding birds in warm weather, especially thistle and suet.
9. Don't feed your pets outside.
10. Secure your garbage (especially diapers). There are special bear-proof garbage cans that have proven effective. Bears also find certain scents, such as mint and/or ammonia repellent.
11. Clean your grills and utensils well after BBQing
12. Cover your pool(s). Bears love to swim and play in water.

**The Board of Health strongly urges residents to abide by the Borough of Tenafly's smoking ordinance and provides the following information:**

The smoking of tobacco products is a major contributor to indoor air pollution and breathing second hand smoke is a cause of disease to nonsmokers. Reliable studies have shown that environmental tobacco smoke is a cause of cardiovascular disease in nonsmokers and that breathing environmental tobacco smoke is a significant health hazard for children, the elderly, and individuals with cardiovascular disease, impaired respiratory function, and asthma. The U.S. Surgeon General has found that separating smokers from nonsmokers within the same air space does not eliminate the exposure of nonsmokers to environmental tobacco smoke;

Smoking shall be prohibited in the following places:

- ⇒ Every room, chamber, lobby, hallway, restroom, plaza, and other common areas in and upon any public building;
- ⇒ Any entrance or exit areas of any public buildings where smoke may enter the air people breathe through such entrances, exits, windows or ventilation systems.
- ⇒ Any vehicles owned and/or leased, in part or entirely, by the Borough of Tenafly.
- ⇒ On any public property including parks, recreations areas, playgrounds, and swimming pools. This prohibition on smoking shall not apply to individuals in privately owned vehicles, provided that all debris is retained within the vehicle.
