Promoted to the rank of Sergeant was William Barnes II. Sgt. Barnes holds a Bachelor of Science degree from Richard Stockton College of NJ and started his career with the Tenafly Police Department as a civilian dispatcher in 2005. He joined the force in the capacity of a police officer in 2006 where he served in the patrol division before being assigned as the department's Juvenile Officer in 2012. In 2014, he became the department's first School Resource Officer. During his time as an SRO, he worked with school administrators on a litany of matters including school security upgrades, practices and procedures. He provided students with helpful information, guidance, and implemented programs designed to educate them on the dangers of impaired driving. He further dealt with sensitive student matters with tact, professionalism, and compassion. And lastly, he made great strides to improve community relations between the police department and the students that will last many years to come.

Promoted to the rank of Lieutenant was Michael Greeley. Lt. Greeley was born and raised in the Borough of Tenafly. He attended and graduated from the Tenafly public school system before earning a Bachelor of Arts degree in Law & Justice Studies from Rowan University and a Masters Degree in Administration from FDU. He shares a common bond with family members who serve in law enforcement with his late father, brother, and brother-in-law all serving as sworn law enforcement officers, and his sister as a State Corrections Officer. One of my goals for 2019 is to reenergize the Mayor's Wellness Campaign. In 2017, Tenafly was one of the first communities in New Jersey to be designated a "Healthy Town". 

TIME TO RENEW YOUR PET LICENSE!

In the beginning of every year, under state law residents are required to renew the licenses for their dogs and cats. Renewal notices were mailed out the first week of

January. In case you did not receive your renewal license, you can either call Borough Hall or click on the "Online Pet Registration" link on the Borough website home page. You can also use the website if you are registering your pet for the first time.

You just input your information and your pet's information. You need to upload the rabies certificate and other applicable documents. Payment is accepted via debit or credit card. You will receive all confirmations via e-mail until you receive the license and tag in the mail.

During the renewal process, applications will only be accepted online or by mail. So, if you do not have access to a computer, you can send back your renewal form with the rabies certificate and payment to: Borough of Tenafly, 100 Riveredge Road, Tenafly, NJ 07670 – ATTN: Pet Licensing.

If your pet's rabies vaccine expires before October 31, 2019 you must either obtain a booster shot or a certificate of exemption (VPH-28) from the veterinarian. This is also required under state law.

Renewals must be received (not postmarked) by Thursday, February 28th to avoid a late fee of \$10. If you file a renewal online starting March 1st, the \$10 late fee will automatically be included in the charge.

During his time in the department, he served as a community policing officer, field training supervisor, evidence officer, detective, firearms instructor, and a crisis negotiating team member. He also rode a bicycle from Ground Zero to Washington D.C. for the Police Unity Tour several times, and currently serves as a member on the Tenafly Recreation Board.

Promoted to the rank of Captain was Timothy O'Reilly. Capt. O'Reilly has over 28 years of police experience, serving his first 2 years with the Conrail (CSX) P.D., followed by 26 years with the Tenafly Police Department. Prior to his employment with the Borough, he earned a Bachelor of Science degree from Old Dominion University. He also comes from a long line of lawmen with his grandfather, father, brother, 3 uncles, and 4 cousins all having served, or currently serving as sworn law enforcement officers. After three years of service in the patrol division, Capt. O'Reilly was assigned to the Juvenile Officer position in the detective bureau. He served as a detective conducting general investigations when not handling juvenile matters until he was promoted to the rank of sergeant in 2006. From there he served as a patrol squad supervisor until being promoted to the rank of lieutenant in 2012 where he served as a patrol squad commander. During his tenure with the department, he had served on the Bergen County Prosecutor's Office Computer Crimes Task Force for 18 years, and currently serves as the department's Terminal Agency Coordinator in addition to many new administrative duties.

We congratulate all three officers on their much deserved promotions, and wish them success in their new leadership roles in the department.

COUNCILMAN VENU MENON

Councilman Venu Menon has been a Tenafly resident since 2005. His daughter, Divya, grew up in Tenafly and attended Maugham School and TMS before graduating from THS in 2017.

Professionally, Venu has been a banker for most of the past 30 years, first working for Fleet Bank (now Bank of America), then CLS Bank International and most recently, National Bank of Kuwait. Tenaflly Dedicates Memorial to Medal of Honor Recipient, Sgt. Nicholas Oresko

On this past Veterans Day, November 11, 2018, citizens of Tenaflly gathered for a well-attended dedication ceremony at the newly renamed Oresko Memorial Green, the park on Tenaflly Road facing the post office. The memorial was dedicated to longtime Tenaflly resident, WWII veteran and Medal of Honor recipient, Master Sgt. Nicholas Oresko.

The park has been upgraded with a beautiful stone monument in memory of Sgt. Oresko as well as newly paved walking paths and benches. For two months this past fall, Balitano Contracting of Fort Lee NJ worked on the small park that was chosen as the location for this important memorial and designed by Edward Confair of E&LP Associates of Princeton, NJ.

Nicholas Oresko was credited with saving many American lives during the Battle of the Bulge in Europe as a result of his actions on January 23, 1945. Sergeant Oresko was presented with the Medal of Honor by President Harry S. Truman on October 30, 1945 for courage and bravery shown by Oresko's single-handed attack on a German bunker. The Medal of Honor citation acknowledged Oresko for his "quick thinking, indomitable courage and unswerving devotion to the attack in the face of bitter resistance and while wounded."

This memorial was in the planning stage for several years since Sgt. Oresko's death in 2013. At the time of his passing, the WWII veteran had lived in Tenaflly for 57 years and was the oldest living Medal of Honor recipient in the country. He also participated in many Tenaflly Memorial Day Parades and served as Grand Marshal more than once.

The park dedication was organized by the Historic Preservation Commission and Mayor Peter Rustin. The keynote speaker, Major Chris Carbone, who served in Iraq and Afghanistan and knew Sgt. Oresko personally, delivered a beautiful speech about Oresko's lifetime and character. Major Carbone said that Oresko's advice to other fellow soldiers was to "Be humble, because your deeds are not as significant as the fellow soldiers who lost their lives." Sgt. Oresko was said to have always put other people's needs in front of his own. Many veterans attended the park dedication and, like Major Carbone, came dressed in full uniform representing their branch and years of military service. Boy Scout Troop 25 presented the color guard and Olivia Catona, a Tenaflly Middle School eighth grader, sang the National Anthem.

The memorial and dedication ceremony were an absolute success. Many citizens watched the ceremony with heartfelt smiles on their faces joined by a few tears.

Historic Preservation Commission member Michael Barone said afterwards that "it was an honor working on the park's planning committee. The memorial dedicated to Master Sgt. Nicholas Oresko will allow many future generations to reflect on the actions of this American hero."

IT'S NOT TOO LATE TO GET A FLU SHOT!!

Flu season in the United States is usually in the fall and winter months. The peak of the season is between October and April. The flu can be prevented in several ways:

- Get the flu vaccine
- Cover coughs and sneezes
- Wash Hands frequently
- Avoid sick people
- Clean commonly shared or frequently touched items
- Treat flu illness to prevent serious complications. Ask your healthcare provider about medication (antivirals) as soon as you notice any flu symptoms.

Here's a reminder of where to go if you're hurt or ill:

Hospitals statewide are experiencing long emergency wait times this flu season as cases have increased more than compared to last year.


1. No idling of vehicles while at center.

SNOW REMOVAL



After leaf season, the main priority of the DPW is to keep borough streets clear of snow and ice. Residents can help by not throwing snow onto the streets. It is against Borough Code to shovel or plow snow onto the streets. The reason for this prohibition is **safety** – as snow melts and refreezes it causes icy spots that can cause serious accidents.

Snow removal regulations (*Borough Ordinance 12-3*) require property owners and/or tenants to clear snow from sidewalks within 12 hours of daylight after snow has stopped, or within 8 hours of daylight after snow has stopped in business districts B1 and B2. This includes clearing the path to the street for properties located on a corner, and especially on walking routes to schools. If snow or ice is so frozen to the sidewalks as to make complete removal impractical, the ice or snow must be covered with sand or salt.

If a fire hydrant is located on your property, snow or ice must be removed within 24 hours in residential districts, or 8 hours in business districts. You can help protect lives, homes and businesses in an emergency by keeping these hydrants clear.

Residents are asked to instruct private contractors engaged in the snow plowing of their property to not push the snow into the street. It is unlawful for any owner, tenant or private contractor to throw, place or deposit snow or ice that has accumulated on private property, including private driveways, upon streets in the Borough. As snow melts and refreezes, it causes icy spots that can cause accidents. Violators of these regulations are subject to issuance of summons and possible fine.

We ask that you comply with these regulations for the safety of your family, friends and neighbors.

SEWER STOPPAGES

The owner/occupants of premises in the Borough are responsible for proper maintenance and repair of all house sewer connections between the dwelling and the main sanitary sewer line. The most common causes of sewer stoppages are: grease, hair, disposable wipes, paper towels, foreign objects and root growth. Please refrain from disposing any of these items into the sanitary sewer system. Sump pumps are not permitted to discharge into the sanitary sewer system.

In case a stoppage in the sanitary sewer occurs, the owner/occupant shall **immediately** notify the Tenafly DPW who shall make an inspection of the main sewer line. If the main sewer line is obstructed, it shall be the responsibility of the DPW to remove the obstruction. If the main sewer line is not obstructed, the DPW shall immediately notify the owner/occupant to proceed with removal of the obstruction in the house sewer line.



A Hidden "Gem"



One of Bergen County's best kept secrets is right in our own backyard. Greenbrook Sanctuary, a "little gem of wilderness" can be found north of Clinton Avenue off Rte 9W. This 165 acre preserve was established 72 years ago by dedicated citizens to protect land along the Palisades for the preservation and study of its native flora and fauna. It is unique owing to the diversity of its habitats, and its cliff-top location towering approximately 300' above the Hudson River, with unequalled vistas. The non-profit Palisades Nature Association manages this property on behalf of the Palisades Interstate Park Commission, within whose boundaries it is situated.

Greenbrook offers over 7 miles of 14 intersecting trails which are clearly marked and which cover distinct terrains and different habitats. Its namesake Green Brook is the largest of 4 streams feeding a bog and pond, and one of 6 streams that run through the Sanctuary leading to two waterfalls over the cliff edge. Greenbrook Sanctuary is home to abundant native flora and fauna including birds, mammals, fish, insects, amphibians, reptiles and butterflies as well as native wildflowers, shrubs, and trees in a mature woodland. Located within the Sanctuary is an award-winning Orientation & Education Center that profiles the natural and social history of the Palisades, its habitats and ecology.

Naturalist-led walks are held almost every weekend with additional programs scheduled during seasonal events such as the immense Spring migration of birds along the Hudson flyway. The Palisades Nature Association is a member-supported organization that uses its funds to manage the Sanctuary, maintain the infrastructure, employ Naturalists, conduct studies and surveys for scientific recordkeeping, and educational programming. Membership is open to all.

The entire Sanctuary is fenced, and the gated entrance off Rte. 9W requires a key which all members receive. Open access is also available during two annual Visitors' Days. The upcoming Spring date is Sunday, April 28th from 12 noon to 3pm. More information can be obtained by accessing PNA's website at www.njpalisades.org/greenbrook.html

In addition to responding to emergency calls, our members continue to give back to the community by ensuring safety at town events and providing opportunities for young children to learn about emergency medical services.

We want to remind our community that winter is here! Please be sure to remember to keep all paths and walkways cleared as well as having visible house numbers during inclement weather. This all ensures everyone’s safety and that patient care is given without delay. Also some tips for winter is to stock up with an emergency kit including a flashlight and extra batteries, a battery-operated radio, bottled water, non-perishable foods, essential medicines and extra blankets or sleeping bags.


