Thank you to the Tenafly Police and Recreation departments for again organizing and hosting Community Night this year. It was a fabulous event enjoyed by hundreds of residents! And, thank you to the Public Works, Fire, and Ambulance departments, our citizen volunteer groups and local businesses that worked and participated to make the evening a great success for our community!

Continuing on the theme of fun things to do in Tenafly, I would like to share some of the exciting programs happening this Fall at the Nature Center, Senior Center and our Library.

On Sundays in October, adults and families are welcome to visit the Nature Center for a seasonal favorite, Apple Cider Making. You will learn about the history of apple cultivation and cider making and experience one of the original ways of making fresh, crisp apple cider.

Sunday, October 30, the Nature Center is inviting families and adults to the Haunted Forest. This will be a non-scary, entertaining and educational program. Families can arrive early or come after dark and meet several live nocturnal animals along the trails where you will learn about animal senses and test your own sensory skills.

The Annual Turkey Trot 5K is scheduled for Sunday, November 27. Experience sections of the trails as you navigate over roots, rocks, and streams and challenge yourself to stay active and healthy through the Nature Center's acres of wetlands and hardwood forest.

Saturday, December 17 is the Nature Center's annual Winter Solstice Campfire & Night Hike. Celebrate the changing season with a night hike, followed by a toasty campfire with s'mores! Visit tenaflync.org for sign-up details on all Nature Center programs.

The Senior Center is hosting "Pastries with Police" on October 17th. Visit the Senior Center to become more familiar with your local hometown heroes. Every month the Seniors will have a different police officer as a guest for a Q&A with the senior community.

POLICE DEPARTMENT



The Police Department would like to remind residents that the Borough's public and private schools are now back in session. Motorists must use added caution due to the increase in vehicle, pedestrian and bicycle traffic on our roads and sidewalks. Motorists should allow extra travel time to account for the increased congestion. Extra caution should be also be exercised in and around our school zones. Motorists must pay attention to crossing guards and be mindful of their lawful obligation to stop for a raised hand-held stop sign while guards are crossing pedestrians. The crossing guard position is one of the most dangerous jobs in municipal government. Please give them a brake, and recognize the critical job they perform protecting our children and the walking public.

The Police Department would also like to remind residents that automobile thefts and burglaries-to-automobiles are still occurring in the Borough and surrounding communities. These crimes have been become more cyclical, occurring in waves followed by periods of inactivity. This should not be a reason to let our guard down. Always remove key fobs and lock doors for all vehicles, even when parking in your own driveway. As

residents have been educated about the growing trend in car thefts, some thieves have adjusted their tactics to attempt these crimes. We are now also hearing reports of some car thieves breaking into, or entering unlocked garages to steal vehicles from inside of the garage. Residents should be mindful of this trend, and remember to lock your car and remove key fobs even from vehicles that are parked inside of a garage. Our officers are always proactively patrolling the streets, but we need your help. If you see or hear something in your neighborhood, say something. Our officers will respond and investigate. If we all do our part, crimes like these can be reduced. The members of our Police Department thank all of you for your cooperation and support.



TIME TO RENEW YOUR PET LICENSE!

At the beginning of each year, under state law, residents are required to renew pet licenses for their dogs and cats. Renewal notices will be mailed out the last week in December 2022.

In the event you do not receive your renewal license application by January 6, 2023, the form may also be found on the website by searching PET REGISTRATION.

You can also apply online, using the Online Pet Registration link on the Borough website: **www.tenaflynj.org - Government - Clerk's office - Permits - Pet Registration.**

You will need to input your information, your pet's information and upload the rabies certificate and other applicable documents. Payment online is accepted via debit or credit card. All confirmations will be sent via e-mail until you receive the license and tag in the mail.

If your pet's rabies vaccine expires before October 31, 2023 you must obtain either a booster shot or a certificate of exemption (VPH-28) from the veterinarian. This is also required under state law.

Renewals must be **received** (not postmarked), by Tuesday, February 28th. Any renewals after this date will automatically be charged a \$10 late fee.

Through the NASW, she has been a Certified Advanced Social Work Case Manager for nearly 10 years. Ms. Agin Levin received her undergraduate degree from the University of Pennsylvania and her master's degree from the Wurzweiler School of Social Work.

VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT



Home fires occur more in winter than in any other season. As you stay cozy and warm this winter, be fire smart!

DEC JAN FEB

Half of all home heating fires occur in December, January and February.

1 in every 7 home fires and 1 in every 5 home fire deaths involves heating equipment.

Keep anything that can burn at least 3 feet from any heat source like fireplaces, wood stoves, radiators or space heaters.

Keep portable generators outside, away from windows, and as far away from your home as possible.

Install and test carbon monoxide alarms at least once a month.

Plug only 1 heat-producing appliance (like a space heater) into an electrical outlet at a time.

Have a qualified professional clean and inspect your chimney and vents every year.

Store cooled ashes in a tightly covered metal container, and keep it outside at least 10 feet from your home and any nearby buildings.

Carbon Monoxide

Often called the invisible killer, carbon monoxide (CO) is an odorless, colorless gas created when fuels such as gasoline, wood, coal, propane, etc. do not burn completely. In the home, heating and cooking equipment that burn fuel are potential sources of CO. Carbon monoxide incidents are more common during the winter months, and in residential properties.

Winter storms

Most of the U.S. is at risk for winter storms, which can cause dangerous and sometimes life-threatening conditions. Blinding wind-driven snow, extreme cold, icy road conditions, downed trees and power lines can all wreak havoc on our daily schedules. Home fires occur more in the winter than in any other season, and heating equipment is involved in one of every six reported home fires, and one in every five home fire deaths.

Generators

Portable generators are useful during power outages, however, many homeowners are unaware that the improper use of portable generators can

be risky. The most common dangers associated with portable generators are carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning, electrical shock or electrocution, and fire hazards. According to a 2013 Consumer Product Safety Commission report, half of the generator-related deaths happened in the four coldest months of the year, November through February, and portable generators were involved in the majority of carbon monoxide deaths involving engine-driven tools.

Candles

Candle fires peak in December and January with 11 percent of candle fires in each of these months. Christmas is the peak day for candle fires. Each year between 2015-2019, an average of 7,400 home candle fires were reported each year.

Electrical

Electrical home fires are a leading cause of home fires in the U.S. Roughly half of all home electrical fires involved electrical distribution or lighting equipment, while nearly another half involved other known types of equipment like washer or dryer fans, and portable or stationary space heaters.

ENVIRONMENTAL COMMISSION



WHY COMPOST?

If just 1% of people living in cities worldwide started composting, it would have the same environmental impact as planting a 3.5 million acre forest.

Debunking common myths surrounding composting:

It is too hard and too much effort!

If you can put two handfuls of food waste and shredded paper in a compost tumbler, you can compost. Don't be intimidated about getting started. If you run into any challenges, there is a wealth of information available online.

It takes too long!

Putting your composter in a sunny spot can help fuel the microbes necessary to break down foods

work faster. Regular turning and keeping your compost moist will speed up the process.

It takes too much space!

If you have room for a suitcase in your backyard, you have room for a composter. If you don't, pooling with a friend or neighbor can be a great way to collaborate and encourage green habits.

It attracts pests!

This isn't necessarily a myth, but a caveat. Adding meat and dairy to your composter can attract pests. Using an enclosed space like a commercially-available raised tumbler discourages pests. Good compost should not stink, stinky compost is an indicator that you need to add more nitrogen-rich material like dry leaves, cardboard, or shredded wood.

There's no point if you don't have a garden!

Soil-quality matters no matter whether or not you are trying to grow anything. Feel free to use composted soil for houseplants or even just for dirt in your backyard. Higher-quality soil has a stronger ability to retain water, improving flooding in your yard.

LEAF COLLECTION

Each year, town-wide leaf collection begins October 15th and runs to December

1st. The Department of Public works collects leaves and grass only that is placed loosely at the curb. Do not cover storm drains or place leaf piles near storm drains. Pursuant to N.J. Stormwater Regulations, leaves may be placed at the curb no closer than ten (10) feet from a storm drain inlet. Please do not put brush, twigs, branches or any other foreign matter into these piles. It not only makes the job more difficult and dangerous, but also contributes to the breakdown of our leaf collection equipment. To enable equipment access to pick up the leaves, do not park on or close to leaf piles. If you choose to bag your leaves, they must be put into biodegradable paper bags only. Please call the DPW at 201-568-4134 to have the bags picked up. Paper bags of leaves will be picked up from October 15th to January 31st only.

Plastic bags will not be collected under any circumstances.

Branches and twigs must be separated from leaves. These are collected by Waste Industries on your regular garbage collection day. Branches, twigs and garden refuse should be placed into a reusable container (not larger than 30 gallon capacity) with lid at the curb for pickup with your garbage. Branches must be no longer than 3 feet in length and should be tied in bundles or neatly stacked at the curb for pickup by Waste Industries on regular garbage collection days. For any skipped garbage pickups call **Waste Industries at 201-567-3100.**



SNOW REMOVAL

After leaf season, the main priority of the DPW is to keep borough streets clear of snow and ice. Residents can help by not throwing snow onto the streets. It is against Borough Code to shovel or plow snow onto the streets. The reason for this prohibition is **safety** – as snow melts and refreezes it causes icy spots that can cause serious accidents.

Snow removal regulations (Borough Ordinance 12-3) require property owners and/or tenants to clear snow from sidewalks within 12 hours of daylight after snow has stopped, or within 8 hours of daylight after snow has stopped in business districts B1 and B2. This includes clearing the path to the street for properties located on a corner, and especially on walking routes to schools. If snow or ice is so frozen to the sidewalks as to make complete removal impractical, the ice or snow must be covered with sand or salt.

If a fire hydrant is located on your property, snow or ice must be removed within 24 hours in residential districts, or 8 hours in business districts. You can help protect lives, homes and businesses in an emergency by keeping these hydrants clear.

Residents are asked to instruct private contractors engaged in the snow plowing of their property to not push the snow into the street. **It is unlawful for any owner, tenant or private contractor to throw, place or deposit snow or ice that has accumulated on private property, including private driveways, upon streets in the Borough.** As snow melts and refreezes, it causes icy spots that can cause accidents. Violators of these regulations are subject to issuance of summons and possible fine.

We ask that you comply with these regulations for the safety of your family, friends and neighbors.

TENAFLY RECYCLING & CONVENIENCE CENTER (TRCC)

REGULATIONS AND REMINDERS:

1. Maintain face mask usage and social distancing procedures while at center.
2. No idling of vehicles while at center.
3. No trailers or commercially registered vehicles are permitted.
4. Plastics #1, #2 and #5 only are accepted for recycling.
5. Styrofoam, plastic bags, pizza boxes and packing material are not recyclable – place in trash.
6. Please read signage for proper disposal of items. If unsure, ask an attendant.
7. Decal issuance is suspended during Covid-19 Pandemic. Residents may receive temporary pass at the center by providing current Driver License and/or proper address documentation.



TREE REMOVAL PERMIT APPLICATIONS ARE PROCESSED FROM 8:00am to 2:30pm MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY.

DISPOSAL OF BRANCHES AND TREE LIMBS

Sticks, branches and tree limbs from residents' yards are collected by the garbage contractor, Waste Industries, 201-567-3100. They must be put into a garbage can and placed at the curb for pick up on your regular garbage collection days. Large branches must be cut into lengths 3 feet or less and bundled for pick up. Do not use blue borough recycling containers, as this material is not recycled.

SEWER STOPPAGES



The owner/occupant of premises in the Borough shall be responsible for proper maintenance and repair of all house sewer connections

between the dwelling and the main sanitary sewer line. The most common causes of sewer stoppages are: grease, hair, disposable wipes, paper towels, foreign objects and root growth. Please refrain from disposing any of these items into the sanitary sewer system. Sump pumps are not permitted to discharge into the sanitary sewer system.

In case a stoppage in the sanitary sewer occurs, the owner/occupant shall **immediately** notify the Tenafly DPW who shall make an inspection of the main sewer line. If the main sewer line is obstructed, it shall be the responsibility of the DPW to remove the obstruction. If the main sewer line is not obstructed, the DPW shall immediately notify the owner/occupant to proceed with removal of the obstruction in the house sewer line.

Collection Box Open for USED CLOTHING AND SHOE DISPOSAL



The Tenafly Recycling & Convenience Center accepts all used clothing and shoe items for recycling. Residents may bring all of these items to the Tenafly Recycling & Convenience Center to be recycled. There is a Collection Box marked for these items. All items placed into these boxes are used, re-used or recycled into other items for use. Please consider donating these items. By reusing items we save the natural resources needed to make them and save space in landfills. Making new items from old products saves our community money, conserves natural resources and reduces pollution of air, water and soil.

WATER COURSES AND DRAINAGE DITCHES

Residents are responsible for maintenance of streams, water courses and drainage ditches on their property.

Section 12-4 of the Borough Code details the maintenance responsibilities of property owners and residents. It is unlawful for any owner, tenant or occupant of any lot or tract of land across which there exists any drainage ditch, ravine, stream, culvert or other water source, to permit the accumulation of loose brush, fallen leaves, tree branches, dead trees, stumps, garbage, trash and/or other debris to the extent that such accumulation presents a risk of washing downstream thereby causing a blockage of said water course, and/or flooding or damaging of adjacent downstream properties.



ELECTRICAL WASTE DISPOSAL

New Jersey Governor Christie enacted legislation that revised the State's electronic waste management program to exclude electronic waste products from being disposed of in the trash.

As of January 1, 2018, all electronic items such as televisions, computers, monitors, desktop printers, desktop fax machines, laptop computers **must be recycled**. These items should be returned to the stores where they were purchased. The law requires these stores to accept them for disposal at no charge. In the case that this is not possible, residents may bring items to the Tenaflly Recycling & Convenience Center for recycling.
